- Finance Committee was formed last year with advisory objectives for the bank balance, to recommend what the PTO can do with the remainder that is in-line with the PTO mission. Last year, it was proposed to do what had occurred in the past: spend $\$ 2500$ on Miscellaneous and $\$ 2500$ on Wish List. Bylaws allow spending of surplus within a timely manner with PTO vote.
- Wish List items need to be in-line with curriculum and the district teaching, meet PTO guidelines, requires a vote, and approval from the Principal.
- A request for wish list submissions was sent to class room teachers only in the beginning of November. Current wish list submissions include: request for new $5^{\text {th }}$ grade teacher for easel; Mr. Bubser requesting Front Row Math program.
