## Call to Order/Opening Remarks <br> 7:01 p.m.

- Principal's Breakfast on Monday 2/29 had only 5 attendees. Encourage greater participation for these events. This month's event had 9 guest speakers and is an opportunity for parents to ask questions. Participant work hours could be an issue.


## Officers' Reports

## Principal's Remarks

Ms. Neela Thakur

- Bring Someone Special Dance - the $1^{\text {st }}$ year annual event chaired by Janet Carbo was highly successful with 245 people in attendance. The event was enjoyed by parents and students alike. Thank you to Janet for the detailed planning and organization and the help of many volunteers.
- SBAC Standardized Testing - students in grades 3-6 students will take the SBAC in May. Changes from last year's test include: three components of the test have been eliminated for grades 3-8 (teachers and students will have 1 hour and 50 minutes less of testing) and high school level SBAC was eliminated. Not a lot of SBAC test prep. The curriculum will prepare students for the test.
- Superintendent's budget has received Board of Education approval at the $2 / 23$ meeting. The budget is now pending town council approval. The budget proposal slide show presentation from the meeting can be accessed on the Board of Education website. The next two meetings are open to the public on $3 / 21$ and $4 / 187$ pm. The Town Council will vote on the budget and the following major topics for Emerson-Williams at the $5 / 15$ meeting:
- Security personnel at the elementary school level. This position is not a full time person and would be assigned to all of the elementary schools in the district.
- Increased clerk hours (from 25 to 29 hours)
- New teacher for grade 5 due to the high class size (currently 50 students). This year a long term substitute teacher helped to maintain class sizes at 17 students. At 25 students it is very difficult for a teacher to reach all of the students.

- Thank you cards to the PTO from Linda Ciarcia for the medicine cabinet and from Mrs. Harris' $3^{\text {rd }}$ graders for the stability balls.
- Revenue: $6^{\text {th }}$ grade fundraiser ( $\$ 232$ ); Butter Braids (\$1200); Someone Special Dance (\$454); Yankee Candle (\$3000).
- Expenses: Paid insurance; Paid High Touch - High Tech Balance; Paid Wolf Pack; Paid Stripes costume.

- March is music in schools month. In March there are several events to celebrate music in schools:

- Family sing-a-long (music songs and games) on Tuesday 3/29 and Wednesday $3 / 30$. 52 have signed up for Tuesday and 54 on Wednesday. Thank you to Autumn/Nathalie for creating the flyers.

- New Britain Bees event on $5 / 25$. Colleen and Diana organizing the event. There is a $4 / 21$ deadline to get the total number of ticket requested to the Bees ( $4 / 8$ is our deadline). $\$ 12$ per ticket located behind home plate. 120 tickets reserved.

The 2 additional risers would cost $\$ 3980$ and ensure that no students would have to be on the floor during concerts, parents would be able to see their children, and would be the safest option for our students.

Future Projects
Colleen Mattatall

- K-1 Playscape Replacement - decided at last meeting to explore possibility of $\mathrm{K}-\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ grade playscape replacement. Playscape is currently 17 years old (with average life of 20 years). Current playscape is up to code and was last inspected in December. Visited other playscapes in town. Many playgrounds in town were built by Miracle Recreation: Mill Woods, Highcrest and both Emerson playgrounds. Mikey's Place and Glastonbury's Riverfront Park were built by Landscape Structures.
- Obtained quotes from Landscape Structures, Creative Recreation (Miracle playgrounds) and APC Play, a national company with no playscapes built in CT, nearest one is in Westfield MA:
- Creative Recreation/Miracle Recreation - option 1 is $\$ 36,904$ (includes playscape, professional install and mulch, landscape and drainage costs). Option 2 is $\$ 34,554$ (includes playscape, professional install and mulch, landscape and drainage costs).
- Landscape Structures - option 1 is $\$ 42,587$ (includes playground, professional install, border and mulch but does not include cost for drainage/land prep). Option 2 is $\$ 49,678$ (includes playground, professional install, border and mulch but does not include cost for drainage/land prep). Option 3 is $\$ 43,266$ (includes playground, professional install, border and mulch but does not include cost for drainage/land prep).
- APC Play - option 1 is $\$ 30,000$ (includes playground, professional install, border and mulch but does not include cost for drainage/land prep). Option 2 is $\$ 27,000$ (includes playground, professional install, border and mulch but does not include cost for drainage/land prep).
- Cost would be the same to tear down the current playground or keep current playground and expand. Rubber surfacing instead of mulch would add an additional \$27,000.
- Marty Sitler recommended using Creative Recreation (Miracle playgrounds) because they have a local contact who has done a lot of work with our town and who is very helpful and knowledgeable.
- Met with Marty Sitler and Alan from Parks \& Rec, Fred Bushy from school buildings/operations, John Hallerbach from Miracle Recreations, Darka Jara and Autumn Struk from the PTO and Neela Thakur to discuss next steps. We decided on a location for this structure that would not disrupt class, would not impede on open space or impact the fields. We discussed drainage issues and costs associated with flattening the land.
- Next steps are to gain formal approval from (in this order): (1) PTO; (2) Principal; (3) School Administration; (4) Fred Bushy; (5) Board of Education; (6) Town; (7) Present to Planning and Zoning commission
- Process will likely take 6 months to complete with a possible August 1 purchase date to have it installed before school begins next year.
- Autumn searching for grant money and ways to cut the cost. She has approached Creative Recreation who, through previous relationship with them, knows they offer grants. We have also found a website that, through March $30^{\text {th }}$, can apply for grant for a playground. Need to research more funding to cut costs (i.e., grants from Lowe's, state and town grants, and www.togethercounts.com/healthy-playground-makeover.com).
- Proposal to re-discuss this at next meeting and vote on whether or not to go forward. Questions can be sent to Colleen at smiley9188@aol.com or 860-490-8760.

## Wethersfield Schools Parent Council (WSPC) Joanne Pine / Karen Dicenso

- Meetings are held on the second Thursday of every month from $12 \mathrm{pm}-2 \mathrm{pm}$ meetings. 2 representatives from every school. Last meeting was on 3/10:
- Safe Route to School - March $30^{\text {th }}$. Kids in gym to talk about the different ways to get to school safely. Eliminate need for parents to drop off kids. Walk to school with friends.
- School nurse communication (with all schools in Wethersfield not just Emerson-Williams)
- A letter went out to $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade students in January due to lice (last time detected at school). School nurse policy is for nurses to wait until 2 cases are found per class before notifying parents. Would like whole school to be notified even if 1 case is found.
- Forms for nurse's office - when a student goes into the nurse office the name, reason, time and cure should be documented. Parents should be notified if a child is injured at school to know that the child went to the nurse's office. There is a monthly computerized log of incidents that happen at school.
- Bike to school - 5/4 - flyers will be sent home.
- Volunteer recognition form - email Karen / Darka. Submissions are confidential. Nominate someone by $3 / 303 \mathrm{pm}$. Recognition ceremony to held on $5 / 117 \mathrm{pm}$ in Webb Auditorium.
