- Welcome to the many new PTO attendees at the meeting, including several teachers (1<sup>st</sup> grade team - Ms. Buckley, Ms. Foley and Mrs. Jones) and Kindergarten teacher Mrs. Jahne.
- EW community received a school messenger email and Facebook post at 8:05am on Wednesday, • April 6<sup>th</sup> due to approximately <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour school evacuation. A few staff members smelled gas in the building and pulled the fire alarm. Students were evacuated away from the building. The fire department and CNG determined it was a routine venting of the gas meter. Messaged out as soon as building was all set.
- Town Council budget vote on Monday 4/18 7pm in the Town Council chambers. Public may attend and speak at the meeting. There is an impact on the school district and EW if any of these items are cut. Voting will occur at the budget meeting for the following:
  - Security personnel at all of the elementary schools currently 1 person rotating among the 5 schools
  - Increased hours for administrative clerk Ms. Intino, from 25 to 29 hours
  - An additional teacher for grade 6 in 2016-17 (for the current 5<sup>th</sup> grade class 48 class members). Keep the 3 teachers the class currently has when they move to grade 6 in the fall

Caroline Fazzina, Keane On Kids After School Enrichment Program

- Keane Foundation grant funding of afterschool program at each of the elementary schools. EW is currently the only school without an afterschool program. The reason the program was initiated is due to the inconsistency of afterschool programs at the elementary schools.
- The program has a dedicated director of academic enrichment for all 5 schools and a site coordinator/supervisor starting at the end of the school day throughout the program duration to handle all needs such as dismissing of children at end of program. Will need to hire a site coordinator (preferably a paraprofessional in the schools or teachers with specific focus) trained in handling any issues, where the children are familiar with them.
- Students will register for this program in the same way registration occurs for all enrichment programs, through parks and recreation. Emerson-Williams will have a page in the bulletin and may use that form or go on-line to register.
- Programs and activities (some multi-day) from school end time to 4pm. Funding issue to extend past 4pm but considering this for the future. 1 hour enrichment activities, 1 hour homework and 1 hour gym to get kids moving. Children in the program will go to the media center. School attendance list used daily. YMCA (currently occupy the gym) is willing to work with building and use (Joanne McPhee) to negotiate times for the gym.
- Can modify class format to make it more affordable for students who can't afford the class. Should not be prohibitive for anyone. Minimal cost to student used to pay for instructor and materials. School social worker can let them know so they can help families. Funding available.
- Programs based on the needs of the school community. Examples might be: arts, sciences, Legos, gym, yoga, engineering club, etc. Suggestions from PTO members: Kids Zumba, art, foreign language (Spanish), computers (Minecraft), hip-hop, no-bake class (healthy choice), chemistry based, gardening, martial arts, chess, gymnastics and acting.
- A Survey Monkey will be created as a starting point to rate choices (what the children might want to attend) and additional programs may be added over time. Email Caroline with any ideas at <u>kfafterschoolenrichment@gmail.com</u>.

Future Projects

• K-1 Playscape Replacement

- Colleen Mattatall
- Obtained 10 quotes committee discussed the 10 quotes and narrowed down the playscape to Creative Recreation/Miracle Recreation (model #718-S059J) with primary colors matching the new playscape on the other side of the school. Same company installed the new playscape (Creative Recreation/Miracle Recreation). Location of playscape would not disrupt classes or impede on open spaces or the field in this area.
- Price: \$36,904 (\$28975 playscape and professional install and mulch; \$7929 landscape and drainage costs). Location hasn't been surveyed yet so this might not be the final price.
- Grant searching applied for 5 grants and asked for 5 monetary donations from banks.
  3 grants denied due to eligibility. Applied to Keeney Foundation, Lowes Tool box for Education, Finish Line Youth grant, Lowe's (store), Home Depot, CT Humanities, First Niagara Bank and TD Bank.
- Approval obtained from Ms. Thakur and Superintendent Emmett on 3/24
- Next steps: approval from Fred Bushey, Board of Education, Town approvals, and planning and zoning commission.
- Letter from Paul LaPerriere had large surplus from previous playscape. Endorsed using these funds to install the new playscape.
- Motion to move unreserved equity to a dedicated fund (\$40,000) for the installation of the new K-1 playscape by Shana Smith. Seconded by Karen Dicenso. Unanimous (30 votes). Approved.

- Total sales were up 7.7% from Spring 2015
- Catalog sales decreased 17.27%, while online sales increased 79.38%. This is contributed to advertising as a paper reminder sent home in the back pack, in Tiger Topics, on PTO Facebook posts, and in a PTO email.
- \$3,228.00 Catalog Sales = 50% Profit \$1,614.00
- \$1,256.00 Online Sales = 40% Profit \$502.40
- MBD requires a 5 sample product purchase that lowered our profit by \$32.20 (cost + shipping). This is after Leslie paid \$11.75 out of pocket for 2 of the 5 samples.
- Total net profit \$2,084.20, which is \$323 more than Spring 2015
- Products were delivered to Leslie's house tonight by FedEx. With only one day left prior to Spring break it will delay delivery to parents.
