## Officers' Reports

## Principal's Remarks

Ms. Neela Thakur

- Thank you for everyone supporting the STEM event last week, a $11 / 2$ hour family event (engagement with children) incorporating science, technology, engineering, and math. The event was coordinated by Kathy St Onge (EW Curriculum Specialist). Twenty (20) staff members stayed through the event ending at 8 pm and others contributed games, signage, and activities. 70 families participated with 32 families participating in the egg drop. Thank you to Deb Burn for going up and down the ladder to drop the eggs. Let Neela know if you have any suggestions or improvements for next year. Shana Smith suggested that the egg drop could have been a station like the other events.


## Board of Education Representative

Elaine Paradise/Bobbie Granato

- Bobbie Granato (40 years involved in the school and town) and Elaine Paradise (teacher for 37 years in Wethersfield) spoke at the meeting:
- Operating budget: $\$ 58$ million to keep what we currently have. No new initiatives. No new positions in this budget. Increase of 2.9\% over this year.
- Salaries and benefits: compose most of the budget (79.8\%) for 2017-18. Increase of salaries and benefits only.
- Salaries - 3.16\% increase over current year (comprises 64.5\% of the 2017-18 budget).
- Benefits - $7.14 \%$ increase over current year.
- Other highlights of the 2017-18 budget:
- Textbook upgrades deferred. Decrease for books, periodicals.
- Maintenance and repairs are deferred.
- Any money remaining in the budget will be used for resources to keep the school modern and updated. For example, all kids in the Grades 3-6 classrooms have access to Chrome Books.
- Keep extra money for field trips.
- Focus is to maintain class size (under 20 for K-3 classrooms). Class sizes can't get large.
- Focus on school security.
- Governor is providing relief from some mandates for the future. They have requested the unfunded mandates list.
- For each . $25 \%$ cut to the budget amount to a $\$ 141,000$ budget cut. Imperative to keep what we have without any additional cuts.
- Voice concerns through email or by speaking at the Town Council meetings. Need help and support of the current budget without any additional cuts.
- 2/14-presentation of the budget by Michael Emmett at the Board of Education meeting.
- $3 / 67 \mathrm{pm}$ - Town Council meeting (Town Council chambers)
- $3 / 15$ - Town Council will see the budget by this date. Any emails to the board before this time will help to support no cuts to the budget. Town website has town council emails.
