## Officers' Reports

## Teacher Representative

Jim Coursey, EW Physical Education Department

- Mr. Coursey has been a physical education teacher for 20 years and after completing his Master's degree in Industrial Technology, he has worked on integrating technology within his physical education curriculum.
- He discussed the prospect of purchasing heart rate monitors and incorporating this technology within his physical education curriculum, to monitor exercising and tap into who is pushing themselves to their maximum potential. Heart monitors would help his $3^{\text {rd }}$ to $6^{\text {th }}$ grade students with their perception of exercise and their self-awareness to maximize their potential. The heart rate sensor data would be informational to help get students into the zone that they are supposed to be in. Mr. Coursey would start with $6^{\text {th }}$ graders and move backwards, eventually to $2^{\text {nd }}$ graders. Sensors monitor heart rate and the info can be tracked on an iPad.
- Mr. Coursey asked the PTO for a one-time purchase of the Heart Zone 30 pack ( 30 arm bands, 1 dual bridge, and 2 ports which can charge 24 for a class, with 6 extra monitors): \$4830 + shipping ( $\$ 150-\$ 200$ ). Total: $\$ 4974.50$. There is a 1 year warranty but will look into if its extended. Currently has a projector, screen, and iPad. Mr. Coursey will also see if there are references to other elementary schools that use them.


## Principal's Remarks

Ms. Neela Thakur

- Welcome back from April vacation.
- Thank you for helping to encourage children during the Look for the Good project $(3 / 17-4 / 3)$. There were discussions with the children about gratitude and the children wrote letters about gratitude. Staff coordinators for the project will be doing a presentation in front of the board of education on Tuesday 4/25 about the project.
- Children in grades 3-6 will take the SBAC from 5/9-5/19. English Language Arts and Math testing. 45 minute segment only. The testing will be computerized, untimed, and an adaptive test, where difficulty of questions will adjust based on grade level. Interim assessment blocks subset of math - 12-13 questions taken on the computer. The teacher gets the results immediately to help understand which questions many students got wrong and why, as a learning tool.
- Budget is now in a holding pattern until $5 / 15$ when the town council notifies the board of education. We will have more info on the budget after $5 / 15$.
- Principal's Breakfast topic was writer's workshop. Discussed the components and the model that is being used from K-6. Observed a Kindergarten and $4^{\text {th }}$ grade classroom.
- Thank you to Colleen Mattatall for advocating cosmetic improvements from the building department. A walkthrough of the school resulted in a crew coming into EW to paint the Kindergarten hallway. The town will also provide a clean slate and a board for volunteers to paint a mural using supplies provided by the town. Volunteers could paint the board elsewhere and then it would be placed on the wall. We need a team of teachers and parents to identify key spots in the building that could be made to look bright and new.
- The capital improvement list has removal of carpeting and replacement with tiles on the agenda during the summer. A couple of classes in the $6^{\text {th }}$ grade wing is on the agenda for summer.
- Thank you for the most recent turnout at the town council meeting.
- We would like to save the gratitude wall located in the main hallway by the nurse's office. The sentiments from the children during the 10 day Look for the Good project will eventually fall (note cards taped to the wall). Need volunteers to lead the effort to research how to save this work, cost, and time frame. Monika Shoham agreed to lead the effort. Autumn Struk volunteered to help.
