## Guest Speaker

Caroline Fazzina, Director of Keane on Kids After School Enrichment Program

- Successful program encompassing all the schools with a little over 1800 enrollments, with 600 individual students participating in the afterschool program. The program currently runs 3 days a week in each school.
- Fall program schedule will be finalized in July and the offerings brochure will be available in August. The program will start one week later than last fall (start date is determined by Parks and Recreation). Offerings will include minimovers, chess, yoga, dance, cooking, art, running club, crafts, Legos, computers, and mad science, among others. The programs will run the same days at all schools as this year.
- The program welcomes suggestions from the school community for program ideas or if someone wants to do a program.
- Basic Spanish - Nathalie would like to teach a class
- Caricature Drawing - recommended by Diana
- Computer Coding - recommended by Monika
- Adaptive Movement Parkour (AMP) - recommended by Autumn

- Internet Safety Concepts: Empowering Smart Online Choices - Assembly educating parents and students about on-line dangers. Presentation by Scott Driscoll for $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ grade students at the elementary school level. Mr. Driscoll provides presentations for both adults and children.
