## Principal's Remarks

Ms. Neela Thakur

- Instructional supply budget - budget is now unfrozen. Teachers are now able to place orders and replenish supply.
- EW Math tutor - we have not been given permission to rehire our math tutor. Tutor was funded through the Open Choice grant funded program. EW can't hire back until they give the go ahead. EW and Highcrest currently do not have a Math Tutor.
- Grateful Tigers campaign - kickoff assembly was today (11/9). The campaign will run for 1 week. Board of Education chairperson Bobbie Granato helped kickoff the program. Neela encouraged members of the PTO to teach kids what the words grateful and gratitude mean to piggyback on our lesson from school. Asked parents to add to the gratitude wall.
- Food Share - dropping off food next Wednesday 11/15 from 5:15-5:45. Monday and Tuesday next week are the last 2 days to donate. Email went home about Food Share and donations. EW staff and students will donate live on air between 5:15-5:45. Stripes will also be there.

## New Business

- Keane Foundation Grant application (due 12/31) Colleen Mattatall
- End of December deadline. If you have any ideas let Colleen know. Colleen is an affiliate/associate member.
- VOTE: Hip Hop
- EW teachers were not awarded the hip hop grant. The PTO allocated $\$ 3600$ for special programs but planned to use the funds for color run if it had not been funded by Keane. Now we still have these funds.
- Proposal made to use $\$ 3600$ under special programs to sponsor the 4-day hip hop program (\$2600) - shared sessions.
- There is no deadline but traditionally we decide in December.
- Could we split the costs between PTO and school? 1st year paid by school, $2^{\text {nd }}$ year by PTO, $3^{\text {rd }}$ year by grant but facilitated by PTO.
- Should we look into 2 events or something less of a cost?
- Mrs. Kardys said that the assembly talks about health and fitness and from a teaching standpoint it is excellent. It is an opportunity for the kids to bond and bring families into it. The presenter has developed a rapport with the kids.
- Mrs. Kardys mentioned possible event pair up with Dinner on the Lawn.
- Amy Burlingame motioned to use $\$ 3100$ funds from special programs to fund the 4day ( $\$ 2600$ ) and 1-night ( $\$ 500$ ) program. Motion was seconded by Christen Sousa. 11 yes. 3 no.
- VOTE: Social Services Products
- Vote on the items presented by Ms. Mierzejewski and Mrs. Zuber. Wish list budget $\$ 1550$ remains. Christen Sousa will take this back to her wish list committee to review the request. Amy Burlingame will look into how to get these items for next school year through donations. Christen will send out a final email for wish list items.
- VOTE: Courtyard Rock Project
- Vote on the courtyard rock project presented by the EW Garden Club. Request to help fund rocks and paints for the project to be added to the courtyard. The Garden Club has $\$ 500$ from the Keane Foundation. They are requesting $\$ 700$ to make up the total cost ( $\$ 1200$ ) to purchase the $3 \times 5$ inch rock and paint products.
- Nathalie Trevitazzo proposed to table this until January to look into this further through donations.
- Shana Smith asked, what is the plan for painting the rocks? The rocks will be painted post winter. If no donations come in, the money will be spent by that time.
- Shana Smith made a motion to allocate $\$ 700$ to put towards rocks and paint if we don't get the donations. Motion seconded by Courtney Harlow. 13 yes. 0 no. Approved.
