Director of Wethersfield Food Services

- Discussed the school dining services program, a part of the National School Lunch and Breakfast program. The program offers free and reduced meals by application and reimbursements.
- Healthy and balanced meals. Unlimited fruits and vegetables with all school meals. Only whole grain and whole grain rich goods and snacks served. There are many guidelines that must be followed.
- Nutrition education and tasting events. Every month a new food is focused. Classroom and cafeteria-based learning with Resident Dietician and District Chefs.
- Food allergies and medical conditions many allergies these days and there are steps to make sure that the children are receiving the right foods. Information cane be obtained on Nutrislice website/app: Wethersfield.nutrislice.com. One on one special diet menu development by parent request.
- Pricing: Breakfast (\$1.60), Lunch (\$2.60), and Milk (\$0.60). Many à la carte items.
- Lunch program:
 - If you purchase a lunch, you are offering unlimited fruits and vegetables.
 - Minimum of 4 choices every day.
 - Tuesday through Thursday can select a smoothie for lunch.
 - Can also purchase a second lunch.
- Breakfast program:
 - Want students to eat breakfast at home or school.
 - Low in participation for breakfast. Students might be unaware that they can eat breakfast at school.
 - Reduced is 100% free.
 - A staff member monitors the cafeteria through 9:15am so late arrivals or on-time students have the opportunity for breakfast before going to class.
- Snacks cash only policy unless something is on file. Same as for allergies. When the student enters their code, an alert will appear for snacks and allergies.
- My School Bucks an online program online that can let you view and monitor what your kids are eating. It also allows you to add money online (with transaction fee). Alerts can be setup (if balance is low can set automatic reload). Need student's ID number. Email Jamie if you don't have the number.

- Ms. Neela Thakur • Mrs. Katie Nunn, 4th grade EW teacher, in attendance. Wanted to show appreciation for PTO and came to support the PTO at the meeting.
- Career Day: 19 parents and community members participated in the 6th Grade Career Day. There was good interaction with the presenters, with the purpose of connecting learning and school for future potential careers.

- Dr. Dribble Assembly (3/15) to teach perseverance learning. Creative ARTs / PTO event which was partially funded by the Keane Foundation.
- Book Club March and April book is 'It Takes a Village.' The students will work on a project • associated to the book.
- Grateful Tigers during May students will focus on the topic of responsibility and giving back. Teachers will have discussions with students on these topics throughout the month.
- Tiger Talk Blog social and emotional learning curriculum blog posts.
 - Personalized Learning: topic discussion by the faculty. How can we can bring parents into the conversation? How do we get kids more excited about learning and how can we cover content but in other more engaging ways?
 - Focus on the 16 habits of mind: Teach students to listen with empathy, work through 0 problems, ask good questions, and teach the soft skills necessary to be a good student. The focus this year is as a staff first and then will prioritize for next year with the students.
 - Social and Emotional curriculum: Different members of support staff will be assigned to 0 different grades. This will be launched at beginning of the next school year for K - 2. Led by school social worker, school psychologist, etc. 20 lessons for each grade level. Upper grade levels to follow in subsequent years. Currently do this but it is sporadic so now all elementary school in Wethersfield will have the same curriculum.

Wethersfield Education Foundation presented and are currently in fundraising mode at this point with a focus on larger scale projects.

- Committee met on 3/20. Budget is similar to this year. Budget presented is a draft. Between now and May, please submit any suggestions or questions to Peping at treasurer@ewpto.com.
- 2018-19 Budget items of note:
 - Color Run on 9/8 is scheduled before Book Fair and Open House. Sprit Wear will be sold. Do we need \$1500? Should the money be moved to Dollars for Scholars?
 - Parent's Night Out in October with a possible spring event.
 - Yankee Candle and Cookies will go out together in November. Purpose to add new different fundraiser, such as Parents Night Out. Comedy Night, etc.
 - New fundraisers: Munson's Chocolates, Paint Night, Restaurant Night, Parents Night Out. Leslie asked if the new events will be scheduled for early fall to determine if they will generate the expected funds earlier.
- If a project comes up next year, we will vote instead of adding it upfront to the budget.
- Some programs that we don't expect money to be generated (i.e., breakeven) will appear as \$0 on the budget.
- Dollars for Scholars currently \$500 and will remain for next year's budget. Consider raising the EW scholarship amount.
- Shana Smith asked for a correction on the budget: from STEM to STEAM on the budget.
- Yesenia Fuentes recommended an on-going pledge donation. Many businesses make donations at the beginning of the school year, but we have not considered on-going donations. More research is needed.
