# • WSPC

#### Amy Burlingame/ Colleen Mattatall

- State Commissioner of Education resigning on Jan 1<sup>st</sup>. New Governor to vet candidates for approval, will take approximately 6 months.
- Board of Ed has not begun school budget for next year. So budget is operating in black, no deficit, no budget freezes.
- New building use form is online only now.
- $\circ~$  Mr. Emmett interviewing for Webb and Middle school principals. Webb has a candidate to start in Jan.
- Walk to School happened last month.
- Courageous conversations program offered to a few staff members which address your inherent biases and examining it. Opens conversations among faculty and families. Wethersfield is becoming an increasingly diverse community and socioeconomic differences could affect a child's learning, etc.

### Board of Ed

#### Colleen Mattatall/ Peping Dee

- Focus was on the Facilities Study. BOE has deferred maintenance on schools for so long that systems have become obsolete. Example: CW heating system is made by a company that went out of business in the 1980s so parts and repairs are very costly.
- EW needs new roof, double paned windows are cracked, classrooms have original furniture, some which are damaged or rusted, etc.
- Overall cost to update schools is \$31.7 million for all schools, \$17 million of which is high priority and needs to be done w/in next 3 years (regulatory concerns, physical environments and safety.
- EW has \$7.1 million of that overall total, making us second to Highcrest in needing money for repairs. But our repairs are 3<sup>rd</sup> in line of priority to CW and Hanmer.
- $_{\odot}$  Current enrollment at EW is at 90% and anticipated to increase to 93% in 10 years.
