Stop & Shop A+ Rewards Program Update





Health Tips

Well I have seen it already!

The dreaded poison ivy is back. Here are some interesting tips regarding these irritating plants:



Poison ivy

- It is the Urushiol Oil that is the culprit with these plants [Poison Ivy, Oak and Sumac]. Only a very tiny amount is needed to cause a reaction.
- 1-5 years is normal for this oil to stay active on any surface, even dead plants.
- POISON IVY RASH IS NOT CONTAGIOUS. You can only spread the rash if the oil is left on your hands.
- BREAKING THE BLISTERS OF A RASH DOES NOT SPREAD IT. The blisters contain only fluid produced by your body.
- The oil from the plant is the only think that spreads the rash.
- DO NOT BREAK THE BLISTERS BECAUSE IT CAN CAUSE AN INFECTION. Instead, keep blistered areas covered with a gauze bandage if possible, especially on the hands and fingers.
- 90% of people are allergic to Urushiol oil. The more times you are exposed to it, the more likely it is that you will have a reaction.
- Rash usually occurs 24-48 hours after exposure. If swelling and blistering are rapid [within 4-12 hours of exposure], get emergency treatment. Go to the emergency department or call your doctor.

REMEMBER: LEAVES OF THREE, LET THEM BE!!!!
