Health Tips

6th graders:

Keep getting the physical forms in to me. If you have not sent in the reminder slip, please do so ASAP. I still have many students that have not gotten them in. A delay in the transfer of health records and progress reports may occur if I do not receive the form before June 1st 2014.

All children should be in school when they are well, but trying to decide if they are well enough can be a difficult task. We all know they can wake up feeling one way and an hour later feel another way. The goal is to have your child in school, ready to learn; but prevent the transmission of viral illness to classmates. Thank you for keeping our school community healthy.

Here are some guidelines to follow:

- ➤ A child with a temperature of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- ➤ Students should be free of a fever for 24 hours without the aid of fever reducers, such as acetaminophen [Tylenol] or ibuprofen [Motrin] before returning to school.
- ➤ If a child vomits; they must be home for 24 hours before returning to school.
- ➤ Students with excessive secretions from coughing, sneezing, or runny nose should be kept home to prevent the transmission of illness to others.
- ➤ Students diagnosed with Strep throat, from a throat culture, must be on antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.

For headaches, stomachaches, and sore throats, the decision to send your child to school should be based on your child's ability to focus on his/her class work and learn.

A Message from the school Social Worker

Every March, the **National Association of Social Workers** (<u>www.socialworkers.org</u>) celebrates **Social Work Month** as a way of highlighting the services and values of the profession.

Wethersfield Public Schools has provided **Social Work Services** to students and families since **1961.** You can imagine how the needs and stressors of families and students have changed in that time! Currently there are 4.5 social workers assigned at least part time to every school in the district.

School Social Workers are required to attain a Master's Degree in Social Work and maintain a State of Connecticut School Social Work Certificate to serve in the Connecticut School System. Many of the School Social Workers in Wethersfield also maintain LCSW's, a level of professional licensure with the Department of Public Health beyond school certification that would enable them to practice privately as well. School Social Workers are mental health clinicians in the school setting that provide support in a three-tiered approach: providing prevention, assessment and intervention. This three-tiered approach is essential to well-being of all human beings across the life span. In addition to the three-tiered approach, School Social Workers also engage in advocacy, policy and program development, clinical work with students and families, collaboration and consultation with colleagues and a myriad of other roles and responsibilities. They engage with typically developing children experiencing the trials of life such as anxiety, divorce and death, among many other developmental and social concerns, as well as at-risk and vulnerable students who may receive mandated supportive services.

Social Workers are professionally trained in various models of therapy including Solution Focused Therapy, Play Therapy, Family Centered Therapy, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy among others. They have training in the growth and development of children as well as all individuals across the life span. Through this training **School Social Workers** have acquired specific skills to support and understand families, as well as the dynamics that present families with challenges throughout their lives at various stages of change. A **Social Worker's** training enables her to foster positive social change that sustains the individual and family or other social support system involved.

From The Art Room



Hello families! I am so excited to be having our school wide art show again this year! The date and additional details will be announced soon. Please take a look below at some of the concepts and techniques you child has been working on this year in art. There is also an Art link on our school homepage with questions you can ask your child about their artwork. Please visit our school Artsonia account to see the wonderful artwork they have been working so hard on. You can even create a fan club for your child so other family members and friends can comment on their artwork!

Kinders have been learning how to handle art materials with care, as well as practice their fine motor skills. Some things we have learned include; what a portrait is, how textures are used in artwork, and color theory including the primary and secondary colors. Later this year we will be learning about African art, architecture and creating patterns in our art. We will work with paint, found objects and model magic among lots of other exciting things!

1st graders are excited about all they now know about Chinese New Year! A few things we have learned so far include the art of Paul Klee, working with clay to create a relief tile and using patterns in our art. We also practiced a running stich with yarn for our pattern mittens! Later this year we will learn about the art of India and the famous Impressionism artist Claude Monet.

2nd grade has learned about the famous artist Georgia O'Keefe. They created their own nature paintings and practiced observational skills. We are also learning how to create value in paintings. The most recent lesson was inspired by Henri Matisse and his beautiful Fauvism paintings. Fauvism means wild beast in French. Why would they call him that?! We will be learning about the art of Van Gogh as well as the abstract artist Kandinsky who painted to music.

3rd graders have been learning about the cultures of Australia and China. We have created clay fish sculptures and Aboriginal bark paintings. Perspective and how to create points of view including aerial and profile views were practiced in our snowman art. We are currently working on Chinese Imperial Robes. Later this year we will create copper relief plates and jungle collages inspired by Henri Rousseau!

4th graders are learning about Pop art and artists including Wayne Theibaud and Claus Oldenburg. They are using forms such as cylinders and cones to create dessert paintings. We have also learned how lines can be used by artists to express actions and emotions. Later this year we will be working with clay and create artwork inspired by Native American artifacts.

5th grade has been creating amazing abstract and realistic self-portraits. We have discussed why artists create portraits and what we can learn by looking at them. We studied portraits throughout history including; Picasso, DaVinci, and Grant Wood. We are currently learning color theory to create an altered color wheel. Later this year we will be creating gargoyle sculptures and study Gothic architecture!

6th grade has focused on observational skills to create contour hand drawings in American Sign Language. They have also worked with wire to create an animal inspired by the artist Alexander Calder. 3-dimensional masks were created after learning about the Mexican celebration Dia de los Muertos. Currently, sixth graders are creating paper dragon sculptures after learning about the significance of the dragon in Chinese culture. Later this year we will continue to work on observational skills to create a still-life. We will be learning about Egypt and work with printmaking materials!

Babysitters Needed




