On Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, Adam Assi, Michael Gionfriddo, Jason Maulicci and Nate Sommers participated in an Honors Chorus sponspored by the National Association for Music Education. The National Association for Music Education is among one of the largest education organizations in the world. These fifth grade students were chosen for their musical ability, and Ms. Fox coached and accompanied them to this event that was held at the Hartford Convention Center.

In order to foster a sense of community and responsible student behavior, the Student Council along with the teacher leaders of the Student Council, have initiated weekly recognition of students who display one of the pillars of character that is featured for the week. The characteristic, such as cooperation, is announced at the beginning of the week and classroom teachers submit names of students who demonstrate cooperation. On Friday, these students' names are announced over the public address system, and a picture of the students is displayed on the Pillars of Character Bulletin Board.

Emerson-Williams is now in its seventh vear of involvement with the award winning Discovery Center program. The Discovery Center is a non-profit organization begun in 1992 and is committed to bringing together students from urban, suburban and rural communities in central Connecticut in order to shape positive attitudes about racial and cultural differences. The Discovery Center pairs schools from different communities; our sister school for the past five years has been Kinsella Magnet School for the Performing Arts. Students from Emerson-Williams join their sister school peers in a camp experience at Camp Woodstock in Woodstock, Connecticut. In fourth grade, our students attend a one day orientation and while in fifth grade, the students attend for four nights and five days. In sixth grade, our students attend for two nights and three days. Our sixth grade students attended camp from April 6<sup>th</sup> through the 8<sup>th</sup>, and our fifth grade students will attend from May 2<sup>nd</sup> through May 6<sup>th</sup>. The students and Emerson-Williams teachers that attend are extremely enthusiastic about the experience.

I know that the PTO has worked diligently to plan a week of exciting events for TV Turn Off week during April 11<sup>th</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup>. I hope that many families will be able to attend the offerings during that week.



### Strawberry Fest Classroom Baskets




Dear Emerson- Williams Parents,
