

Cultural Corner

From Art Educator Ms. Richard

This year in art each grade will be studying a different culture from around the world! We will focus on Poland in Kindergarten, Chinese New Year in 1st, African masks and Kente cloths in 2nd grade, Japanese brush painting in 3rd grade, Native American textiles in 4th, and the art of India in 5th. 6th graders just finished learning about the history and traditions of Dia de los Muertos. We watched a wonderful documentary outlining the history of its creation and the melding of the Spanish and Zapotic Indian traditions to form this important celebration. 6th graders created cardboard relief Calaveras (skulls) where they had the option to honor a loved one who has passed through symbols and details in their art. There were many wonderful connections shared, and we also took the opportunity to discuss cultural stories and traditions the 6th graders participate in at home. One student compared the Turkish food they eat at home to dishes another student from Nepal loves! Sharing these stories and learning about cultures around them through art and artifacts is a wonderful opportunity for your children to



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


