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From the Desk of Ms. Neela Thakur, Principal

I am so very sorry that many of your families have been hit with the stomach bug this fall / winter. As a mom myself, I know how awful this can be. In my conversations with my colleagues across the district, it is very clear that the stomach bug has hit us all district-wide, not just at EW. I am grateful to all of you who have taken the time to reach out to me directly to express your concerns about the stomach bug. Both the week before Thanksgiving, as well as the week after Thanksgiving, I reached out to central office to share your concerns. As a result, our custodial staff has been focusing their cleaning more on bathrooms, the nurse's office, water fountains, and a more thorough wipe down of classrooms surfaces including table tops / desk tops and doorknobs. In addition, we have been using some Morning Meeting time with students to discuss good handwashing practices.

The viruses that cause gastroenteritis (or "the stomach bug") are spread very easily through close contact with infected people, such as by sharing food or utensils, and by touching contaminated surfaces and objects. The contagious period - the time during which a sick person can give the illness to others - can range from a few days before the onset of symptoms, to up to a week or more after illness, depending on which virus is causing the stomach bug. This is a major factor that makes it so difficult to prevent the spread of the virus.

Frequent good hand washing with soap and water and using hand sanitizer is the most effective way to help stop the spread of these viruses to others. Avoid touching the T-Zone (mucous membranes of the eyes, nose, and mouth). Touching your own face can introduce viruses into your body. The T-Zone is the only portal of entry for upper respiratory and GI illnesses.

Other ways to help stop the spread of the illness are to follow these important auidelines:

- A child with a temperature of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- Students should be without a fever for 24 hours without the aid of fever reducing medications such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen before returning to school.
- If your child is vomiting or having diarrhea, they must be free of symptoms for 24 hours before returning to school. Often times, they may need an extra day at home until they are back to feeling themselves.

Thank you for doing your part to stop the spread of the stomach bug here at EW. It is greatly appreciated. Please know that our custodial staff is aware and concerned and has been doing their part to assist, since before Thanksgiving. Again, I truly appreciate everyone's communication and support. I certainly hope all of your families are healthy for the rest of this winter season.
