The beginning of December has been proven to be busy and exciting for our students. Parents should be receiving their child's Degree of Reading Power score. This test was administered in the fall to students in grades 2-6. The Degrees of Reading Power Test assesses students' ability to read nonfiction texts. Students in grades 3-6 will be administered CREC (Capitol Region Education Council) benchmarks in reading and math during the week of December 6th. The results of these assessments will help teachers further analyze the strengths and

weaknesses in these subject areas. In addition, the results will also guide the teachers' instruction.

The second grade team of teachers (Mrs. LaFleche, Mr. Shoemaker and Mrs. Reynolds) has again spearheaded our annual "Mitten Tree". Students are asked for donations of new mittens, gloves and scarves. These items will be donated to Wethersfield Social and Youth Services. The tree is located in the media center, and it looks quite festive with all of the donations. Selected second graders also announce the "Mitten Tree" project every morning during school wide announcements.

I hope that all of the families and members of the Emerson-Williams Community have a restful, healthy and peaceful holiday season and New Year.
