

From the Principal's Desk

It's getting close to that time of year where our students will be taking their state standardized tests. Our Grade Five students will be taking the Connecticut Mastery Test (CMT) in the area of Science on Thursday, March 12. Last year, our Emerson-Williams fifth graders scored the highest in the district. I'm confident that our students will perform well this year as well! Then, starting on April 7, and running throughout the month of April, our students in Grades Three through Six will be taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) tests in the areas of Reading, Writing, and Math. (Eventually, Science will be a part of this test as well, but it has not yet been created.) Overall, we are in a much better place for this testing this year compared to last year. Our students have been receiving the typing training, and they have gotten a lot better with their keyboarding skills. In addition, we have 30 Chromebooks per grade level in Grades Three through Six, so students have had much more practice on these devices and this has strengthened their typing skills as well. Last year, with our testing schedule, we had one class of students use the computer lab computers, while five classes of students used the iPads at any one given time. This year, we will still have one class of students who will use the computer lab computers, but the other five classes will use the Chromebooks instead of the iPads. The Chromebooks will work out much better than the iPads, so we are excited about this. As classroom instruction continues to be more and more aligned with the Common Core State Standards, students are better prepared to take the SBAC. One feature of the SBAC that was not piloted with Wethersfield students last year is the adaptability feature of the short answer questions. With the adaptability feature, students will be sent to either less challenging or more challenging questions (still within their grade level) depending on whether they answer questions correctly or incorrectly. This will be a feature of the SBAC testing this year, so we are interested to see how this works. While last year's SBAC testing was called a Pilot, this year's SBAC testing is not. We are eager to see how student scores will be reported to us (as last year they were not reported to us at all), and how these scores will help guide our instruction for the 2015 - 2016 school year.


Babysitters Needed


