As many of you already know, my staff and I are working very closely with your children to teach them all about the Growth Mindset vs. the Fixed Mindset, and help them to understand why embracing the Growth Mindset WILL help them to reach their fullest potential. I strongly encourage you all to purchase and read the book entitled Mindset: The New Psychology of Success - How We Can Learn to Fulfill Our Potential by Carol Dweck. This little gem of a book is the basis of our work with your children. We are even in the midst of hosting a Parent Mindset Book Club. This work is so important to us. What we know and understand, is that in order for us to maximize our efforts with the students, we need to have FULL staff and parent buy-in about the importance of helping students develop a Growth Mindset. If you can, please take 10 minutes to view this brief animation that is narrated by Carol Dweck herself. She does a very nice job of summarizing her own work with this animation. (But please try and read her full book as well!) As you view this video, be mindful of what she advises about how we praise our children. Also be mindful of a very important dinner-time conversation she suggests we should all have nightly with our children. These are such great suggestions!

Tiger Topics Health Tips

The viruses that cause gastroenteritis or "stomach bug" are spread easily through close contact with infected people, such as by sharing food or eating utensils, and by touching contaminated surfaces and objects. The contagious period — the time during which a sick person can give the illness to others can range from a few days before the onset of symptoms, to up to a week or more after illness, depending on which virus is causing the stomach bug. This is a major factor that makes it so difficult to prevent the spread of the virus.

Frequent good hand washing, with soap and water and using hand sanitizer is the most effective way to help stop the spread of these viruses to others.

Avoid touching the *T-zone* (mucous membranes of the eyes, nose, and mouth). Touching your own face can introduce viruses into your body. The T-Zone is the only portal of entry for upper respiratory and GI illnesses.

Other ways to help stop the spread of the illness are to follow these school guidelines:

- A child with a temperature of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- Students should be without a fever for 24 hours without the aid of fever reducing medications such as acetaminophen [tylenol] or ibuprofen [motrin] before returning to school.
- If your child is vomiting, they must be free of symptoms for 24 hours before returning to school. Often times they may need an extra day home until they are back to feeling themselves.





Rais Bhuiyan, an American Muslim from Bangladesh, is an extraordinary individual with a powerful story. After serving as an air force pilot in Bangladesh, Rais moved to the United States in 1999 to study computer technology. Ten days after 9/11, Rais was the victim of a horrific hate crime, attacked by, Mark Stroman, self-described "the Arab slayer," Rais barely survived. Sadly, two other victims were killed. Stroman was sentenced to death; ten years later, Rais led an international campaign, fighting to save Stroman's life. Rais' near death experience sparked a profound journey of soul searching and began his path as a human rights activist for peace, forgiveness, empathy and understanding. Though Rais' effort to save Stroman from execution in 2011 was unsuccessful, his transformative ability to turn hate into compassion and forgive the unforgivable has been transformative. Through his non-profit, World Without Hate, Rais has touched the lives of hundreds of thousands of people as he shares his inspirational story and message at schools, universities, organizations and conferences all over the world

There is no cost to participate in this opportunity, it is provided free of charge through funding secured by the Wethersfield Early Childhood Collaborative.



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


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Stripes-A-Thon
