



## From the Principal's Desk

Our Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) testing is right around the corner. This testing is for all students in grades 3 - 6. Grades 3 and 4 will be testing on April 7 - 10. Grades 5 and 6 will be testing on April 13 - 16. Make-up testing will take place during the week following this. Each day, students will have two testing sessions - one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Each session is 45 minutes in length. It is expected that all students will use up all of the time during the morning session but, for the afternoon completion of the morning's subtest, students are expected to finish at various times. The SBAC is an untimed test. Students will have as much time as they need to complete each sub-test. SBAC assesses students in the areas of English Language Arts and Math. It is a computer-based assessment. Mrs. Harris's class and Mrs. Marks's class will be using the computer lab. All others students will be in their own classrooms, using the Chromebooks. With the addition of the the 30 Chromebooks per grade level (grades 3 - 6) this school year, our students' keyboarding skills have improved a lot, and this will make the SBAC testing easier for students this year. Last year's SBAC testing was a pilot test. This year, the testing is no longer a pilot. In August, we are expecting to receive school, district, and parent reports with individual student scores. It is unclear at this time exactly how the scores will be broken down and categorized. Portions of the English Language Arts and Math subtests are adaptive, which means questions will become easier or more challenging for individual students, based on whether they answer initial questions correctly or incorrectly. We did not pilot this feature last year here in Wethersfield, but some other towns across the country did. All of the various questions that are presented during the adaptive portion are still within the child's own grade level.

The Goals of the Wethersfield Schools Parent Council:

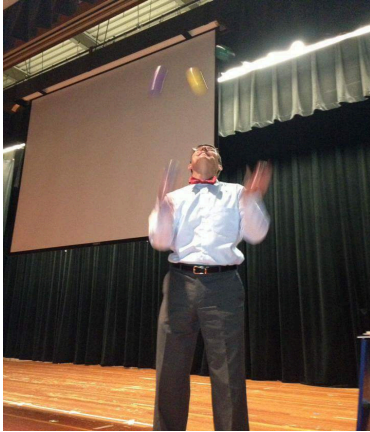

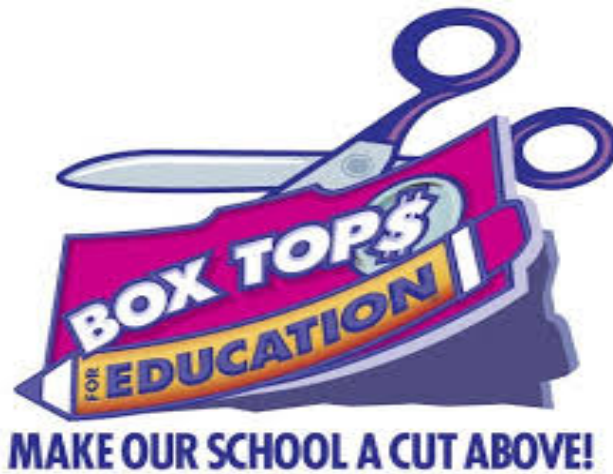

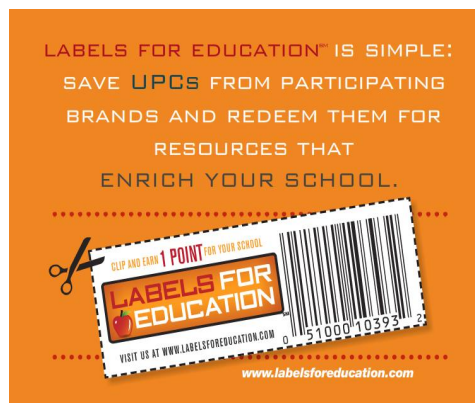
