April is Backpack Safety Awareness Month!

Of all the things we think about as parents of school children, backpack safety may be a low priority. However, backpacks are something to think about as using them improperly over time, can cause long term back problems. To promote a healthy spine for your child, here are some tips to consider:


I. Choose the Right Pack: Choose a pack with wide, padded shoulders to help distribute the weight and contents of the backpack evenly. This will reduce pressure on the shoulders and neck.

- 2. **Pack the Right Stuff:** Pack only the essential items needed. The weight of the backpack and contents should not exceed 15%. For example, an 80 lb student should not carry a backpack weight of more 12 lbs.
- 3. **Lift the Right Way:** When lifting a back pack from the floor, use both hands and bend at the knees.
- 4. **Wear it Right:** Use both straps with a snug fit. Also, the waist strap is highly recommended (if the back pack is equipped with this feature).
