The fact that our beautiful school was ranked as a Category 1 school says so very much about our students, staff, and parents. 

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Tiger Topics Health Quick Tips

Keep getting the physical forms in to me. I still have several students that have not gotten them in. You will not be allowed to enter 7th grade in September without one.

April is Backpack Safety Awareness Month!

Of all the things we think about as parents of school children, backpack safety may be a low priority. However, backpacks **are** something to think about as using them improperly over time, can cause long term back problems. To promote a healthy spine for your child, here are some tips to consider:

- 1. **Choose the Right Pack:** Choose a pack with wide, padded shoulders to help distribute the weight and contents of the backpack evenly. This will reduce pressure on the shoulders and neck.
- Pack the Right Stuff: Pack only the essential items needed. The weight of the backpack and contents should not exceed 15%. For example, an 80 lb student should not carry a backpack weight of more 12 lbs.
- 3. Lift the Right Way: When lifting a back pack from the floor, use both hands. And bend at the knees.
- 4. **Wear it Right**: Use both straps with a snug fit. Also, the waist strap is highly recommended (if the back pack is equipped with this feature).

April 18 – Principal's Breakfast


