For this current 2014 - 2015 school year, one of our school-wide goals focuses on technology. This goal creation was a direct result of the Parent Survey that was conducted last Spring. Overall, our Emerson-Williams Parent Survey results were outstanding last year. However, in the area of technology, we could definitely use some improvement. There was one statement on the Survey that read, "I am satisfied with the technology and other resources at my child's school." We only had 79% of parents respond favorably to that particular question. For the Spring 2015 Parent Survey, we are hoping to raise that percentage to 85%. To that end, every single Emerson-Williams staff member has created a specific action plan to assist our school in achieving that overall school goal. Every teacher's personalized action plan includes three components:

- 1) Ways in which they will infuse more technology into their daily lesson plans.
- 2) Ways in which they will partake in professional development opportunities that will enhance their own comfort level with the technology they are utilizing in their classrooms.
- 3) Ways in which they will communicate with parents to explain how technology is being utilized in their classroom.

This school year, all of the elementary schools across the entire district received (and are continuing to receive) a lot of new technological devices that can be utilized by classroom teachers on a daily basis. This has been fantastic for us this year. Teachers and students have been enjoying these devices tremendously. While more professional development is still needed for my teachers, they have not been afraid to roll up their sleeves and just get started. Below, you will find a list of the new technological devices that have been provided to each grade level / department. I have also expanded my own administrative use of technology by setting up both a Twitter account as well as a Facebook page to communicate with parents. While I will be communicating all sorts of interesting Emerson-Williams happenings with parents via these social media sites, I will also be highlighting the various ways in which my teachers are utilizing the new technology with your children. Tiger Topics Health Tips

DEAR PARENTS and CHILDREN, Welcome back to all!

REMINDER to all sixth grade parents/students:

All students must complete the necessary health assessment and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE 1, 2015</u>. If you had a physical this summer, hand it in NOW. Students will not have their records transferred to the middle school if this is not complete. If you need the State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, it can be found on the PTO website or I will be happy to send you one.

All children should be in school when they are well, but trying to decide if they are well enough can be a difficult task. We all know they can wake up feeling one way and an hour later feel another way. The goal is to have your child in school, ready to learn; but prevent the transmission of illness to classmates and staff.

In light of the most recent news about Enterovirus D68, the same guidelines should apply for any of the viruses we have experienced in the past. This virus is spread like others; by coughing, sneezing and saliva. Symptoms may include, fever, runny nose, sneezing, cough and body aches. Those susceptible of getting sicker, are those children with asthma or a history of wheezing.

These are the ways to prevent the spread of germs: GOOD HANDWASHING, AVOID TOUCHING EYES, NOSE AND MOUTH WITH UNWASHED HANDS, DO NOT HUG, KISS OR SHARE FOOD WITH SOMEONE WHO IS SICK AND COUGHING AND SNEEZING INTO A KLEENEX OR OUR ELBOW.

Here are some guidelines to follow:

- · A child with a temp of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- · Students should be free of fever for 24 hours, without the aid of

TYLENOL OR MOTRIN, before returning to school.

- If a child vomits; they must be free of symptoms for 24 hours, before returning to school.
- Students with excessive secretions from coughing, sneezing, or runny nose should be kept home to prevent the transmission of illness to others.
- Students diagnosed with Strep throat, by a throat culture, must be on antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.
- For headaches, stomachaches, and sore throats, the decision to send your child to school should be based on your child's ability to focus on his/her class work and learn.


