Thanks to all those students who have turned in their physicals already!!



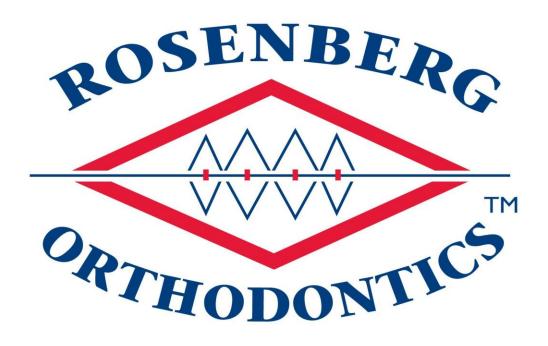
