

## From the Principal's Desk Ms. Neela Thakur

Tuesday, November 12, was an incredibly special day at Emerson-Williams Elementary School. It will be a day that our students will never forget. In honor of Veterans Day on Monday, November 11, we held our Annual "Take a Veteran to School Day." There was such an amazing response to this invitation, that it was necessary for us to hold two separate assemblies on Tuesday in order to accommodate all of the amazing veterans in attendance. One assembly took place in the morning, and one assembly took place in the afternoon. Our Superintendent of Schools, Michael Emmett, joined us for the afternoon assembly, and he loved it. We had 35 veterans present at each assembly, for a total of 70! State Representative, Russ Morin, and I were the featured speakers at each of the two assemblies. But, much more important than our adult sentiments, were the sincere and adorable student presentations. Students sang dramatic / active versions of many patriotic songs; our band and orchestra both played patriotic music; students read both poetry and letters to the veterans; there was a moving slide show set to music, and much much more. There was a formal military roll call where I was privileged to read the name of each and every veteran who was in attendance, and the veterans responded with a proud, "Here!" Toward the end of the assembly, students had the cute idea to present their guest veterans with a memento of a Life Saver, "since they save lives." Out in our main lobby, veterans were able to see our magnificent Tree of Service, where students decorated the various "branches of service" with hundreds and hundreds of Tiger Paws of Recognition for veterans whom they know (even if they were not able to come in to school; some of whom have passed away). There were many smiles in the crowd, and many weepy eyes as well – this whole day was very beautiful and very moving. In honor of Veterans Day, we also had a school-wide Spirit Day in which all students and staff wore our patriotic colors of red, white, and blue to school. Our music teacher, Mary Fox, worked with her students to coordinate every aspect of this very special day. She did a truly spectacular job! I encourage all Tiger families to try and get involved with this assembly next school year, even if the veteran you know is not a direct relative. We'd like to have the opportunity to honor as many veterans as possible.

## From the Desk of the School Social Worker

Hello! I am Maureen Duffy, and I am honored to be the Emerson-Williams School Social Worker working to help your children have the most successful school experience that they can this year!

I have worked for 7 years as a school social worker and before that I was an elementary school teacher for many years. I am also the mother of three children, so I am familiar with many of the challenges that you and your children encounter.

I wear many hats throughout the day that change often!

The majority of my time is dedicated to counseling children either individually or in small groups. Counseling is available to all students have who have social or emotional issues that impact their learning process. Students are referred to counseling through teacher or principal referrals and parent requests. Common topics for counseling include changing families, grief, anxiety and/or anger management, social skills and peer conflict/problem solving.

Another one of my responsibilities is to support the classroom teacher. I present lessons to whole classes on a variety of topics, which are tailored to the needs of each particular classroom. I also work collaboratively with teachers by consulting on students' behaviors in the classroom. When necessary, I observe students in their classrooms and provide recommendations to help improve student behavior.

As I know that parenting can be one of life's most daunting as well as joyful experiences, I am also here to meet with you and other family members to discuss strategies that may help you and your child. Please do not hesitate to contact me at the number or email address below.

## **Health Tips**

**REMINDER to all sixth grade students**: A letter went home recently reminding you about 6<sup>th</sup> grade physicals.

All students must complete the necessary health assessment and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE 1, 2013</u>. If you had a physical done this summer hand it in now. Students will not be allowed to enter seventh grade in the fall if this information has not been submitted. If you need the blue State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, you can print one off of the EWPTO website (<u>http://ewpto.com/Health-Information.php</u>) or I can send one home with your child.

#### A MATTER OF LICE

As a new year begins with new faces; some visitors are not always welcome, I mean those dreaded lice. I would like to provide you with the latest information about assessing and treating head lice.

#### Just the Facts

Lice are not dangerous; they don't spread disease and are not a sign of uncleanliness. Lice do not fly or jump; the only way they can get from one person to the other is <u>DIRECT</u> head to head contact.

The sharing of clothing, bedding, combs/brushes and hats/hair accessories may spread them.

Schools are not the most common place where head lice are spread. Sleep-overs among friends and relatives are thought to be a common way they are passed from home to home.

School-wide head checks are not recommended. The most effective screening occurs when parents check their own children and treat as described below.

Letters are not sent home routinely regarding cases at school unless there are two or more active cases in a classroom.

The "gold" standard if infestation is the direct visualization of live bugs. Contact your pediatrician for Lice treatment options.

If only nits or eggs are present, removing them with a special small toothed comb, is time consuming, but the *most* effective way to get rid of them. DO THIS EVERY DAY UNTIL YOU NO LONGER SEE ANY.

<u>NEVER TREAT ANYONE</u> "just in case". Head lice products can be pesticides, which are toxic if overused and can be absorbed through the skin. If you do need to use them, <u>FOLLOW THE</u> <u>DIRECTIONS EXACTLY</u>.

Shaving or cutting the hair is not necessary.

According to the National Assoc. of School Nurses, children found with live lice should be referred to parents for treatment. One of the biggest challenges is getting parents to communicate the problem to school and to other parents when they find head lice. This may prevent the passing back and forth of this problem.

As school nurses, we are your supportive advocate who can advise you about treatments and help you with checking and rechecking as you work to remove nits and lice from you child's head. 


