On Friday, October 3, I hosted my first Principal's Breakfast for this school year. We had a slight glitch, but everything worked out ok. My guest presenter, Brenda McLaughlin (Reading and Language Arts Consultant) was unfortunately out sick. She had a great presentation planned for parents about Literacy at the elementary school level. However, everything still went very well. At the very last minute, I was able to have fourth grade teacher, Jenn Kardys, assist me with the presentation and, together, everything went well. We had 26 parents present. After discussing the various ways we work hard to promote literacy here at Emerson-Williams in grades K - 6, parents had a very unique opportunity to spend some time with Joanne Charbonneau's fifth grade class. They were able to observe her students work in small groups of 3 - 4 as they engaged in very high level conversations about their books. They were focused on what the author was "whispering" as the important message in the story. Parents present were impressed with how students were able to relate their books to other books they have read, as well as relate the books to their own lives. The students did an excellent job of being very active listeners as their classmates were speaking, and they asked each other great, probing questions. At the end of my Principal's Breakfast, I also gathered some guick, informal feedback from parents on post-it notes. I had them respond to the following three statements:

- Name one thing that either you or your child loves about Emerson-Williams.
- Name one thing that either you or your child thinks can be improved about Emerson-Williams.
- Name one topic that you would like to see covered at an upcoming Principal's Breakfast.

This was very helpful feedback for me and my staff. I want to thank Mrs. Darka Jara for being the parent in charge of the breakfast, as well as all of the other parents who contributed food, drinks, and helped with the set-up and clean-up. I really appreciate everybody's time and effort with this!

Tiger Topics Health Tips by Linda Ciarcia, BSN, RN

DEAR PARENTS and CHILDREN, Welcome back to all!

REMINDER to all sixth grade parents/students:

All students must complete the necessary health assessment and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE 1, 2015</u>. If you had a physical this summer, hand it in NOW. Students will not have their records transferred to the middle school if this is not complete. If you need the State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, it can be found on the PTO website or I will be happy to send you one.

All children should be in school when they are well, but trying to decide if they are well enough can be a difficult task. We all know they can wake up feeling one way and an hour later feel another way. The goal is to have your child in school, ready to learn; but prevent the transmission of illness to classmates and staff.

In light of the most recent news about Enterovirus D68, the same guidelines should apply for any of the viruses we have experienced in the past. This virus is spread like others; by coughing, sneezing and saliva. Symptoms may include, fever, runny nose, sneezing, cough and body aches. Those susceptible of getting sicker, are those children with asthma or a history of wheezing.

These are the ways to prevent the spread of germs: GOOD HANDWASHING, AVOID TOUCHING EYES, NOSE AND MOUTH WITH UNWASHED HANDS, DO NOT HUG, KISS OR SHARE FOOD WITH SOMEONE WHO IS SICK AND COUGHING AND SNEEZING INTO A KLEENEX OR OUR ELBOW.

Here are some guidelines to follow:

- A child with a temp of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- \cdot Students should be free of fever for 24 hours, without the aid of
- TYLENOL OR MOTRIN, before returning to school.
- · I f a child vomits; they must be free of symptoms for **24 hours**, before returning to school.
- Students with excessive secretions from coughing, sneezing, or runny nose should be kept home to prevent the transmission of illness to others.
- Students diagnosed with Strep throat, by a throat culture, must be on antibiotics for **24 hours** before returning to school.
- For headaches, stomachaches, and sore throats, the decision to send your child to school should be based on your child's ability to focus on his/her class work and learn.

Thank you for keeping our school community healthy.


