## **Get To Know... Emerson-Williams Elementary School Principal**

I'm Neela Thakur and this is currently my fifth year as Principal of Emerson-Williams Elementary School. Prior to being Principal of Emerson-Williams, I was a middle school teacher for 11 years (in Bloomfield and Ellington), and a middle school Assistant Principal for 10 years (in West Hartford).

I am a single mom with two children - Alex (19) and Dalis (17). Alex is a Sophomore at The University of New Haven, studying Criminal Justice / Investigative Services. Dalis is a Freshman at The Berklee College of Music in Boston, studying Vocal Performance / Professional Music / Musical Theatre Performance. Being a brand new empty-nester is really hard, but I am slowly getting adjusted to it! My children attended the WPS from Pre-K - 12. They attended Emerson-Williams for K - 1, and then were re-districted to Webb. In my spare time, I love to play tennis, walk, and read.

You may be interested to know that when I was 14 years old, I filed a lawsuit against my school district for sex discrimination under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. My story was quickly picked up by the Associated Press and went worldwide. As a result of my lawsuit, I received hate mail (understatement!) and fan mail from all around the world! I also was victorious in getting my Massachusetts school district to reverse discriminatory practices against female students.

What do you love most about Emerson-Williams Elementary School? Of all the jobs I've ever had, my role of Principal of Emerson-Williams is my favorite! I love absolutely everything about it: the students, the staff, the parent community, and the fact that every single day presents me with unique and interesting challenges and TONS of things to celebrate. My favorite part of this job is spending time in classrooms, and closely observing those powerful moments when students finally "get it," or when students demonstrate enthusiastic joy and excitement over something they are learning or working on or exploring. I love when students realize that learning something new can be absolutely thrilling!

It's incredibly hard to pick just one memorable EWPTO experience, as there are hundreds!!! Very recently, though, I would have to say The Look for the Good Project, the memorializing of our thousands of gratitude posts from our school-wide Gratitude Wall, completely floored me. These gorgeous framed sentiments in our cafeteria make me so happy every single day. The fact that our EWPTO even thought to do this for us, and then carried the project through to completion, I found to be so very special and thoughtful. This is only one small example, though. I find this parent community to be incredibly hard-working, thoughtful, and collaborative in everything they do. As a Principal, I feel so very lucky to have these parents working side-by-side with us. Together, as a team, we can accomplish anything and EVERYTHING for the good of our students.

## **REMINDER to all sixth grade students**:


All students must complete the necessary health assessment and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE</u> <u>1, 2018</u>. Students will not be allowed to enter seventh grade in the fall if this information has not been submitted. If you need the blue State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, I will be happy to send you one.

Thanks to all those students who have turned in their physicals already!!

### The immunization requirements are:

- 1. 2<sup>nd</sup> Varicella vaccine [chicken pox]
- 2. 2<sup>nd</sup> Measles, Mumps and Rubella [MMR]
- 3. Adolescent Tdap vaccine [Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis]
- 4. Meningococcal vaccine

Please check with the pediatrician to make sure these are updated.



# TIPS FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE: HELP KEEP YOUR CHILD HEALTHY AND FLU-FREE

With flu season upon us, it is important that we work together to keep our children healthy. Viruses spread easily among children in schools, and families with school-age children have more infections than others, with an average of one-third of these family members infected each year. By keeping our children flu-free, we benefit the community as a whole. You can help prevent the spread of flu or help your child get better if he/she does get sick by following a few simple steps:

- If possible, you and your child should get a flu shot
- Remind your child to cover his/her nose and mouth with a tissue when sneezing or coughing and dispose of the tissue immediately
- Have your child wash his/her hands frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- Disinfect frequently-touched surfaces and shared items at least once a day
- Ensure that bathrooms are stocked with soap, hand towels and tissues
- Teach your child not to touch his/her mouth, nose and eyes
- If your child is sick and has a fever, keep him/her at home to prevent the spread of illness to others

If you are concerned about your child's flu symptoms, call your doctor early. Call your doctor immediately if your child has a chronic disease. Common symptoms of flu include high fever, severe headache, muscle and body aches, exhaustion, and dry cough. Additionally, children often exhibit other flu symptoms that are rare in adults, such as nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Some children might benefit from an antiviral medication, which can be prescribed by a physician and can help lessen duration of the virus and reduce the risk of complications, such as pneumonia. To be effective, antiviral medication should be taken within 12-48 hours after flu symptoms begin.

Additionally, as a preventive measure, antiviral medication may be administered to children under a doctor's care to help them avoid catching the flu from others in some special situations. For example:

- Children who have egg allergies and therefore cannot receive flu vaccine
- Children who have been vaccinated, but are at such high risk for serious complications due to a chronic condition, that extra protection is warranted
- Children who may not have received a vaccine but are exposed to flu


## Step 2:
