We have been very fortunate over the past two months to have such beautiful weather. There have only been two days to date that have required us to stay in for recess. The teachers and Mrs. Ciarcia are still reporting only positive comments about the recess before lunch schedule. During recess, the students have again renewed their interest in the Walking Club. There are two areas that have been measured on the upper and lower playgrounds for this Walking Club. The students walk or run laps and four times around the designated area equals one mile. You

may have seen your child bring home a chain with plastic feet on it. The feet represent how many miles that they have walked. In September, one mile equaled one foot, but in October you must do 12 laps or 3 miles in order to earn a plastic foot. The students really seem to enjoy this activity.

Mr. Coursey, Physical Education teacher, has set up the Whittle equipment until the end of December. As most of you know, this equipment is used for climbing, coordination and gymnastic skills. Mr. Coursey is excited to teach this unit, and he is presenting a workshop on the Whittle equipment at a state conference later in the fall.

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TIGER TOPICS HEALTH TIPS

With flu season upon us, it is important that we work together to keep our children healthy. Viruses spread easily among children in schools, and families with school-age children have more infections than others, with an average of one-third of these family members infected each year. You can help prevent the spread of flu or help your child get better if he/she does get sick by following a few simple steps:

- If possible, you and your child should get a flu shot
- Remind your child to cover his/her nose and mouth with a tissue when sneezing or coughing and dispose of the tissue immediately
- Have your child wash his/her hands frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- Disinfect frequently-touched surfaces and shared items at least once a day
- Teach your child not to touch his/her mouth, nose and eyes
- If your child is sick and has a fever, keep him/her at home to prevent the spread of illness to others

If you are concerned about your child's flu symptoms, call your doctor early. Call your doctor immediately if your child has a chronic disease. Common symptoms of flu include high fever, severe headache, muscle and body aches, exhaustion, and dry cough. Additionally, children often exhibit other flu symptoms that are rare in adults, such as nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

It is recommended this year that all school age children receive the flu vaccine. There are two types available; the injection and the nasal spray. Both are said to be very effective.

REMINDER to all sixth grade students:

All students must have a physical and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE 1</u>, <u>2010</u>. Students will not be allowed to enter seventh grade in the fall if this information has not been submitted. If you need the blue State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, I will be happy to send you one.

Thanks to all those students who have turned in their physicals already!!
