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Tiger Topics Health Tips

Dear Parents and Children,

Welcome back to all!



REMINDER to all sixth grade parents/students:

All students must complete the necessary health assessment and required immunizations prior to <u>JUNE 1</u>, <u>2017</u>. If you had a physical this summer, hand it in NOW. Students will not have their records transferred to the middle school if this is not complete. If you need the blue State of Connecticut Department of Education Health Assessment form, it can be found on the PTO website or I will be happy to send you one.

We have several children with nut allergies this year. In order to keep these children safe, we have decided to make <u>ALL CLASSROOMS NUT FREE</u>. Please refer to the letter sent home regarding this. Again, this does not affect lunch, only the classroom. Please be sure not to send items with nuts for snacks.

All children should be in school when they are well, but trying to decide if they are well enough can be a difficult task. We all know they can wake up feeling one way and an hour later feel another way. The goal is to have your child in school, ready to learn; but prevent the transmission of illness to classmates and staff.

Here are some guidelines to follow:

- A child with a temperature of 100 degrees or greater should not be in school.
- Students should be fever-free for 24 hours, without the aid of TYLENOL OR MOTRIN, before returning to school.
- If a child vomits; they must be free of symptoms for 24 hours, before returning to school.
- Students with excessive secretions from coughing, sneezing, or runny nose should be kept home to prevent the transmission of illness to others.
- Students diagnosed with Strep throat, by a throat culture, must be on antibiotics for **24 hours** before returning to school.
- For headaches, stomach aches, and sore throats, the decision to send your child to school should be based on your child's ability to focus on his/her class work and learn.

Thank you for keeping our school community healthy.

Emerson-Williams Elementary School New K/1 Playground

I ask a lot of questions. My son gets it from me, I'm afraid. So, in Fall 2015, when I inquired on the plans for the EW PTO bank money, I was told the K/1 playground might need to be replaced 'sometime'. Well, I HAD to dig deeper.

In my research, I discovered our playground was 17 years old and, generally, playgrounds have a lifespan of 20 years. Our current playground was bought by EW PTO! Mary Lacy, of the EW Main Office, helped build it when her children attended EW! I also learned the town inspects playgrounds every year and can either shut-down or condemn a playground for safety reasons.

Was our playground on its last legs? Could we have a decade more left in it? Who knows? I started wondering, how much do playgrounds cost? How long does it take to build? Who needs to be part of this process? And, as a result, the EW PTO formed a Future Projects committee. The committee reached out to 4 different playground companies and received 10 different playscape quotes. As a committee, we decided on one of the quotes and the color scheme. We researched grant money and entered ourselves in a few contests to win a playground. Sadly, we didn't win those grants or contests.

On April 7, 2016, the EW PTO unanimously approved the spending of up to \$40,000 on this playground. I was elated. We were halfway there! At that point, we needed formal approval from the entire town, basically. Parks and Recreation approval included the Town Engineer, Grounds Keepers, Director, Assistant Director, and the TREE WARDEN (yes, kind of like the Lorax)! The Board of Education, then Town Council, then Planning & Zoning Committee, and then AGAIN Town Council all needed to approve or vote for this project. PHEW!

Once we received final approval, we moved forward to buying and building! We had to prepare the land, build in drainage, prepare a flat space, create a border and connect the playground to the flattop with a wood fiber path. We also needed to think about celebrating this wonderful addition to our town and community! We hosted a 'Ribbon Cutting Ceremony' on August 30, 2016 to celebrate its completion. It was wonderful! And, on the first day of school, the children enjoyed this wonderful donation made by the EW PTO. Thank you to every person who played a part in this project, for those who ran fundraisers, bought fundraiser products, attended events and/or meetings, and everyone in between. What a gift we are giving to our children! Enjoy!


