Mrs. Katherine Nunn-Grade 2 Mrs. Nunn comes to us after teaching eight years at Hanmer School. Mrs. Nunn has also taught grades three and six. Mrs. Nunn has completed her Master's Degree in elementary Education and is anticipated to complete a second Master's Degree in the spring of 2012 in Special Education from St. Joseph's College. She has taught Kindergarten and transitional first grade in Burlington, CT, and has been a third grade teacher at Charles Wright School. Mrs. Harris was chosen to be Charles Wright Teacher of the Year for the 2008-2009 school year. Mrs. Harris has been the recipient of the following classroom enhancement grants: Reading Association of Connecticut, **Connecticut Geographic** Alliance, National Endowment for the Humanities: Picturing America. Mrs. Harris has presented for administrators and teachers at numerous workshops and conferences throughout New England on the subject of mathematics. Mrs. Harris has also served on many district committees.

Mrs. Patricia Marks- Grade 3 Mrs. Marks taught fifth grade for six years at Webb School before coming to Emerson-Williams School. While at Hanmer, Ms. Charbonneau was the recipient of a Donors Choose. Org grant which provided her with science equipment for her class. Ms. Charbonneau has been involved in numerous community assistance fundraisers and was nominated for Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science teaching. Ms. Charbonneau has a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from the University of Connecticut and a Master's Degree in elementary education form St. Joseph's College.


