- Possible proposal request for new projector and screen. Estimated cost is \$18,000 and hope to have in fall. Current projector and screen outdated, does not work well, lots of glitches, has to be in front of gym but wires run to back and is a hazard. A company (Valley Communications) recommended by BOE came in to suggest what to do. Jeffrey Telk is still looking into it.

Beautification committee to be in touch with Neela with possibly framing flags.

• Budget 2019-2020

- Sarah motioned to vote on current proposed budget, Peping seconded. Vote approved.
- Rebecca motioned to change and reduce Vendor Fair to \$400, Courtney seconded. No discussion. Vote approved.

Another nomination was announced for Beth Gilbert as co-president. Paper ballot vote completed. Autumn and Sarah counted votes. Beth won and announced as next year's co-president.
