Principal's Remarks

Ms. Neela Thakur

- Ken Lesser introduced from BOE.
- There's a new reading assessment called BAS (Benchmark Assessment System.) Assessment is done in October and May. BAS test has 2 main parts but it's basically a one on one assessment. Blue hand out refers to questions that are asked during BAS. You could ask your child these questions to help them prepare. Ask your child's teacher what level they are at so you can ask appropriate questions. Teacher checks for accuracy while child reads and then comprehension questions are all done orally. The teacher then uses this assessment to group the kids in classroom instruction. Teachers are looking for the instructional level which is the level that's appropriate for the child to advance their reading.
- This assessment is done by the classroom teacher only.
