The 2019-2020 school year is almost at a close and it's been quite an interesting year, no? With so much happening in the world, I'll <u>try</u> to keep the subject on school matters. At the last minute, I decided to create a final Tiger Topics as I was unable to work on the newsletter since the school building's closure.

On June 4th, we had our last PTO meeting and emotions were high. Ms. Thakur discussed distance learning and how difficult it is for the school year is end this way. Plans for distance learning in the fall is 99.9% completed if that's what will occur. Plans for reopening the building in the fall, at this time, is currently zero; this is due to lack of directives, procedures, protocols, and restrictions from the state. If summer school guidelines predict what will come in the fall, reopening the building does not look optimistic. The building would not be a safe place for students and staff. Additionally, this is definitely not how she and the staff hoped for the school year to end.

Parents expressed their appreciation to the school, teachers, and staff. Staff did a great job reaching out to parents and students during distance learning. One parent mentioned how Emerson-Willams has been an amazing and a phenomenal school (as she and her family move into another town this summer). Other parents loved the yard signs placed by 5th grade staff. Staff member Caryn Doten received wonderful compliments at her creative production skills with those amazing morning announcements. Parents raved about Ms. Fortuna's music video classes.

Ms. Root explained how staff is planning and reflecting with the questionnaires to make distance learning better -2.0 as they've been calling it – which will continue into the summer. Social emotional learning and well-being will be a priority going into next year whether it be distance learning or in the building. Resources are being provided by the district, but staff is looking into additional resources as well.

I would like to thank Ms. Thakur and Ms. Root for dedicating their free time to come to our PTO meetings. Your insight and availability for questions has been a wonderful resource for parents. Having that 'facetime' has been beneficial to hear important information regarding the school, teachers, staff, and district. Thank you to other staff who joined us during our

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
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FROM THE DESK OF THE FUTURE EWPTO 1ST YEAR CO-PRESIDENT

The Box Tops program is going digital! No more clipping. No more sending Box Tops to school. All you need is your phone. Download the ALL-NEW Box Tops app, shop as
