## Treasurer's Report

- The current PTO bank balance is $\$ 20,818.74$
- Transactions pending are for P.E. dept budgeted purchases of floor hockey equipment and also air horns for Field Day, as well as $6^{\text {th }}$ Grade class gift.
- In the last month, expenses were paid for $6^{\text {th }}$ grade yard signs, paying $\$ 400$ for a DonorsChoose projects for xylophones for Music's budgeted purchase, $\$ 232.14$ DonorsChoose project for Mrs. Kardys' air purifier, Cheer Committee ice cream for staff $\$ 306$.42. Income was for a PayPal transfer to the bank of $\$ 78.75$ for a combo of both Munson's and Butterbraids, $\$ 137$ and $\$ 101$ respectively for community bag programs, $\$ 108$ for WolfPack Game, and $\$ 340$ for $6^{\text {th }}$ Grade Opt Out.
- Budget committee met on $5 / 2 / 2022$ and had a great meeting with a few changes for next school year.

- Grades 3-6 will be wrapping up SBAC tomorrow for Math and Language Arts. Students are doing an amazing job. It's untimed so they can take their time checking over their work. The majority of students are working slowly and carefully, and also taking breaks too. Students that are not finished will have time to do some make-ups.
- SBAC results will be out in August. Student results get mailed and you should see them in the mail in September.

- Budget meeting took place in person on 5/2/2022 with Laura, Lauren, Colleen, Anthony, Leslie, and Stephanie (online).
- Proposed budget was presented at EWPTO meeting. We'll vote on it in June.
- For Expenses, we added back in $\$ 1,750$ for Creative Arts Council, $\$ 150$ increase to Teacher Fund, and added in anticipated expense for online Quickbooks. We did not add in STEAM Enrichment.
- For Fundraisers, we removed ones not doing well or that no one missed. Since the district is looking into adding an authorization check box for parents to allow their name/email to be released to classroom parents, we have not budgeted nor planned for an Address Directory. However, advertising is still a fundraiser for the newsletter.
- Laura suggested doing away with the very old and slow EWPTO laptop/Quickbooks in favor of online Quickbooks. Motion to approve and seconded by Colleen Mattatall and Andrea Hernandez for up to $\$ 100$ for use in this school year and for implementation of online Quickbooks going forward. 11 ay, 0 nay, 1 abstain.

## WSPC

Colleen Mattatall

- The district continues down the path of a huge renovation of all schools to state of the art buildings to the tune of $\$ 300$ million dollars. The Town is in need of $\$ 170$ million and therefore a November referendum will be out for a vote.
- Schools need huge maintenance in HVAC systems and with 5 elementary schools that's approximately $\$ 32$ million for HVAC systems only.
- The proposal is for a new school to be built adjacent to Highcrest. The old Highcrest building would be a swing school during renovation.
- Charles-Wright Elementary School would come offline leaving only 4 elementary schools in the district. This would require redistricting. There currently is unbalanced enrollment across the district.
- Two new schools would be built - Highcrest and Hanmer.
- Two current schools would be renovated - Webb and Emerson-Williams.
- It is a long process and there are lots of steps to it along with a vote by taxpayers. Money is needed to hire an architect, etc. to continue on this path.
- Autumn Struk is E-W's Volunteer Award recipient. Congratulations, Autumn! We can recognize her at the June Meeting as she said she'll be in attendance.
- The town council voted on the town budget. It passed with a decrease of $\$ 400,000$ of the $4 \%$ increase that the Board of Education requested. They do not anticipate any changes in staff.
- District is looking to take over the transportation of Open Choice students using Autumn Transportation buses.
- Mr. Emmett commented that there are more maternity leaves now than he ever remembers.
- Each school building now has 2 building subs.
- The district is still actively recruiting and hiring.
- WECC is planning district wide playdates, approximately 5 , for incoming kindergarteners at all 5 elementary schools. Dates TBD.
